THE STATISTICS

For over 20 years, The Pyjama Foundation has been dedicated to breaking the cycle of disadvantage faced by children and young people in foster care. The below clearly highlights the urgent need for targeted support and intervention strategies for children and young people in care to improve their educational outcomes, health and overall wellbeing.



57% COMPLETE TEAR .
(OR EQUIVALENT) **COMPLETE YEAR 12**

of young care leavers (aged 18-25) complete Year 12 or equivalent, compared to 85% nationally, highlighting the educational challenges faced by those in OOHC.

of young people in state care end up homeless after they turn 18. Within one year, 50% of state care leavers will be unemployed, in jail, homeless or have become a new parent.

40.8% IN YOUTH DETENTION LINKED TO CHILD PROTECTION

of children in youth detention had involvement with the child protection system. This means young people in youth detention are 19 times more likely to have been in care than the general population.

The Pyjama Foundation provides children and young people in foster care the opportunity to change the direction of their lives with learning, life skills and confidence.

Through our Love of Learning
Program, volunteers called
'Pyjama Angels' are recruited,
screened, trained and then
matched with a child in care
and spend time with them once
a week, focusing on learningbased activities.

Pyjama Angels read books aloud with their child, play educational games and help children with their homework.

Most importantly, the volunteers give foster children a chance to reach their life potential, despite a fragile start.

Children in care have the lowest education outcomes nationally. By improving their learning skills, we are making a positive, lifelong impact.
