# Every hour, two vulnerable children enter the foster care system.

These children often experience a world different to our own, a world full of change and uncertainty. Due to their fragile start, foster children have the lowest educational outcomes nationally.

The Pyjama Foundation is a not-for-profit that empowers children in foster care with positive relationships, learning and life skills. We recruit, screen and train volunteers known as Pyjama Angels, who mentor a child in care for an hour a week. Together they play educational games, read aloud and most importantly, see that learning can be fun!

By getting involved for National Pyjama Day, you will help the Foundation raise awareness and vital funds to continue transforming the lives of children in care with their own special Pyjama Angel mentor.
